### Welcome You . . .

We are sorry you have to be hospitalized but we hope you will be satisfied with your stay at Oakwood. Our doctors and personnel will do all they can to make your period of hospitalization as short and pleasant as possible.

Perhaps you would like to know something about this hospital.

It was opened for patients in January of 1953 and is one of the most modern in the country.

It is a non-profit corporation supported by its revenues and all income goes toward its maintenance and operation.

The hospital is governed by a board of trustees consisting of civic minded individuals who serve without compensation.

The hospital was built with funds received from the Greater Detroit Hospital Fund (which were donated by industry and individuals in the Detroit area), supplemented by (1) a substantial grant of federal funds under the Hill-Burton Act, (2) large direct contributions by industry and individuals, and (3) a substantial bank loan.

It was constructed in Dearborn to serve the residents of western Wayne County.

### Approvals

Oakwood is fully approved by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals. This means the hospital meets the requirements established by this group for maintaining excellent patient care.

The American Medical Association has given full approval to Oakwood for its Intern and Resident Training Program.

## Medical Staff

There are approximately 175 doctors on our staff, half general practitioners and half specialists. They are required to be in active practice in the Wayne County area and to meet the highest standards of the profession.

## Safeguards for Good Patient Care

The hospital and the Department of Health have established certain rules and regulations in order to render the best care to the greatest number of patients. The more important are as follows:

Only two visitors at a time are permitted for patients in a multiple accommodation. This is to prevent overcrowding of rooms and to protect you and your fellow patients from excessive noise and confusion. Please refrain from sitting on the patient's bed.

Children under 12 are not allowed to visit patients, and those under 16 may not visit on Pediatrics. This regulation is for the protection of the children as well as our patients.

Only fathers and both sets of grandparents may visit obstetrical patients. This is a rule we must adhere to very strictly for the protection of the newborn.

Smoking is prohibited in the patient areas for reasons of safety and patient comfort.

Quiet surroundings are desired by most sick patients and this is essential for some patients. Your co-operation, and that of your visitors, will be appreciated.

## Personal Services

- RADIO TV RENTAL—Arrangements can be made by your nurse or at the Information Desk in the lobby. Radios and television sets may not be brought in from home unless they are equipped with earphones, a pillow speaker, or a volume limiter.
- BOOK CART—A Red Cross Gray Lady visits the floors every Wednesday and has books and magazines available for your reading pleasure.
- NEWSPAPERS—A newsboy delivers the Detroit News to the floors every evening. The morning Free Press is available at the main floor information desk.
- COFFEE SHOP—Patients' visitors are invited to use our Coffee Shop which is open 24 hours a day and is located in the main lobby. For the protection of patients on special diets and for sanitary reasons food cannot be taken to patients.
- CHAPLAINCY SERVICE—Appointments can be made by your nurse.
- MAIL—Mail is delivered daily and your letters may be mailed by giving them to any of the nursing personnel. Incoming telegrams are delivered on arrival.
